



INTERMOOR COMPLETES MOORING SYSTEMS FOR OFFSHORE AFRICA DRILLING PROGRAM

HOUSTON (Aug. 2) – InterMoor Inc., an Acteon company, has anchored Mobile Offshore Drilling Units (MODUs) for Cabinda Gulf Oil Company, Ltd. (CABGOC) offshore Southern Africa, Tom Fulton, InterMoor Vice President – Engineering and Projects announced today.

InterMoor prepared the site-specified mooring design and layout for three drill centers in Angola Block 14 of CABGOC’s Lobito-Tomboco field as well as the interface with subsea flowlines at the location. InterMoor supplied all the required mooring hardware for the three 8-leg preset mooring systems, including fabrication of the buoys. InterMoor also oversaw all installation activities for the drilling program. Water depth at the location is up to 1,850 feet.
